1. Marrative:


a. 1 January: Teather: Partly cloudy & cold. Visibility: Fair.

As the period opened, the 534th TD Bn was still attached to the lat U.S. Inf Division. Commany A was attached to the 25th Inf Regt: Company B to the 18th Inf Regt; and Co C to the 15th Inf Regt. The Ron Commany was attached to T "Davisson" whose other elements consisted of the 1st Ron Troops of the 1st U.S. Inf Div, and elements of the 745th Tank Bn (Light Tank Co, one montar plateon, and one 105mm Howitzer Plateon). The TF was commanded by Lt Co. "ENRY L. DAVISSON, C. O., 634th TD Bn. The balance of the 'm (Hq & Hq Co) was attached to the 1st U.S. Inf Biv Arty.

The battalion was disposed as follows: Hq & Hq Co were situated in Sourbrodt, Belgium with the Hattalian CP at (872004). The CP of Co "A" was at Camp Flsenborn, Belgium (391.085) with the 1st Platoon (hereinafter referred to as 1A) in AT mositions supporting the 1st Bn, 26th Inf Fegt at Butgenbach, Celgium (913033): 2A was in AT mositions supporting the 2nd Br. 25th Inf Rest in the vicinity of Dom Butgenbach, Belgium (931031); 3a was in AT positions supporting the 3rd Bn. at (938736) but were relieved by elements of the 745th Tank on, in the evening and went into reserve positions in Butgenbach (913042). The B Co CP was at Nidrum. Belgium (911063) with 1B supporting the 1st Bn, 18th Inf Regt, in AT positions in Butgenbach (912037); 2B supporting the 2nd En in reserve at (911063): 3B supporting the 3rd Bn, in AT positions at (895037). One (1) 15-10 of 2B was in an indirect fire position (879076) prepared to fire illuminating missions with 3" Star Shell on call. The CP of Co "C" was in the vicinity of "alk, Belgium (845058) with 1C supporting the 1st En, 15th Inf Regt in mobile reserve in Guenzaine 20 supporting the 2nd Bn was in AT positions in Weismes Belgium (847030). 30 was in reserve in sumport of 3rd Bn, at (.45058). Task Force "Davisson" had been given the mission of guarding the dam at (845073), and the right flank of the Division. The TF CF was in Walk, Belgium (849936). The CP of Ron Co 634th TD En was also located in Walk (8'4066). 1 Ren, 3 Ren, & Pioneer Ren were also located in Walk. 2 Ren was located in Libomont, Belgium (835045) where the platoon had set un a road block, and maintained defensive nositions. Contact natrols with the 1st & 2nd Bn's of the 15th Inf Rent on the left, and with the 525th Armored Inf on and the 2nd Bn, 120th Inf Regt on the right were being run each night by personnel of the Ron Co. also a road block in the vicinity of the Co CP was being maintained nightly. Or the night of 1 2 Jan 45, 1 hen contacted the 526th Armd Inf Bn 2 the 2nd Bn, 120th Inf; 3 Ron contacted the 1st & 2nd Bn, 16th Inf Rest; & the Picneer Platcon guarded the road block by the Company C.P. A "buzz bomb" landed in the area occupied by 1A during the morning of 1 Jan 45 and hit a house cccuried by a destroyer crew. The house was practically demolished but there were no casualties.

b. 2 January: Weather: Clear to partly cloudy & cold. Visibility: Good.

There was no change in Go A. 2: was relieved by 3B

during the night and 2B went into reserve at Nidrum. This change took place when the 3rd Bn, 18th Inf Regt relieved the 2nd Bn. The one (1) gun of 3B in indirect fire position at (879076) was relieved by a gun of 2B. Company C had no change. Normal contact patrols and road blocks were maintained during the night by Rcn Co.

c. 3 January: Weather: Snow and cold Visibility: Poor.

The A Co sector remained quiet. 1B in supporting an infantry attack, fired 100 rds HF (NC). Due to the poor visibility, the effectiveness was not determined, but the infantry supported, reached their objective without serious resistance, the area covered was about 600 yards wide and the range from 1300 yards to 2000 yards. 1 Rcn guarded road block by Rcn Co CP during the night of 3 - 4 Jan. 2 Rcn remained in Libomont and ran contact patrols to 1st & 2nd Bn's, 15th Inf Regt, during the night of 3 - 4 Jan. 3 Rcn ran contact natrols to 525th Armd Inf in Malmedy and from there contacted the 120th Inf during the night.

d. 4 January: Weather: Snow and cold. Visibility: Fair.

There was no change in Co A. The one (1) Gun of 25 in indirect fire position at (879076) fired two (2) illuminating missions with a total of 3 rds 3" star shell expended. 10 remained in mobile reserve in support of Co B, 16th Inf Regt at (863047). 20 remained in defensive positions in support of 2nd Bn, at (847031) 30 held in reserve in support of Co K, 16th Inf Regt at (836037). 1 Ron ran contact patrols to 1st & 2nd 5n's, 16th Inf Regt. 2 Ron maintained road block and defensive positions in Libemont. 3 Ron ran contact patrols to the 526th Armd Inf Bn, and from there contacted the 120th Inf by telephone. The Pieneer Platoon guarded the road block by the Ron Co Co. Road blocks and patrols were in effect only during the night

e. 5 January: Weather: Cloudy & cold. Visibility: Fair.

There was no change in Co's A, B, or C. 1 Ron ran natrols to the 525th Armd Inf Bn and 2nd Bn, 120th Inf. During the night, the 525th Armd Inf Bn moved and patrols were run to the 2nd Bn. 120th Inf Regt only. 2 Ron maintained the road block and defensive positions in Libomont. 3 Ron ran contact natrols to the 1st & 2nd Bn's, 15th Inf Regt. Pioneer Platoon guarded road block by the Ron Co CP. Road blocks and patrols in effect during the night, only.

f. 5.1anuary: Weather: Cold with show fluries Visibility Fair to poor.

There was no change in Companies A. B. or C. During the night of 5 - 7 Jan, 1 Ren ran contact natrols to the 2nd Bn, 120th Inf; 2 Ren maintained positions and road block in Libomont: and the Pioneer Platoon ran contact patrols to the 1st & 2nd Bn's, 15th Inf Regt. One (1) light Tk Platoon, 745th Tk Bn, took over guarding the read block by the Ren Co CP.

g. 7 January: Weather: Cold & snow. Visibility: Frir to poor.

There was no change in Companies A & C. 28 relieved 18 in Butgenbach (913037) during the night of 7 - 8 Jan, and 18 went into reserve at Nidrum (911063). One (1) Gun of 10 relieved the gen of 28 that was in indirect fire position at (879076). This was accomplished when the 2nd Bn, 18th Inf relieved the 1st Pn, 18th Inf on the line. No other changes in Go B. During the night of 7 - 3 Jan, 2 Ron maintained the road block and positions in Elbomont 3 Ron man contact patrols to the 1st & 2nd Bn, 16th Inf Legty and the Piencer 10 trees contacted the

2nd Bn, 120th Inf Regt.

8 January: "Eather Cold & snow flurries. Visibility

There was no change in Cois A, & C. The one (1) Gun of 1B in indirect fire position at (879076) fired one illuminating mission during the night with a total of 2 rds 3' star shell. During the night of 8 - 9 Jan, 1 Ren ran contact matrols to the 3rd Bn, 127th Inf, 2 fen maintained positions in Libomont, & 3 Ron ran contact natrols to the 1st & 2nd Bn's, 16th Inf Rogt.

1. 9 January: Weather: Cold & snew flurries. Visibility: Fair to moor.

There were no changes in Cols A & B. One (1) M-10 of 10 moved into an indirect fire position at (830060) and was tied into the FDC of the Cannon Cc, 15th Inf Rest. 200 rds H (RC) were fired at a total of 9 targets in the vicinity of Faymonville. All fire was observed. Targets were snipers in buildings. Fire was very effective. During the night of 9 - 10 Jan, I Ren ran consect patrols to 3rd Bn, 120th Inf; 2 Ren maintained positions in Hiboment: 3 Fen ran contact patrels to 1st & 2nd Pn, 16th Inf Regt; & the minneer Platoon guarded the read block by the Co CP.

i. 10 January Weather: Cold and cloudy. Visibility: Fair to

Company A remained in the same position in support of the 26th Inf Regt. The mun of 13 in indirect fire position at (379076) supporting the 13th Inf, fired nine (5) harassing missions and two (2) illuminating missions. S1 rds 3" HE (RC) and 5 rds 3" star shell expended. The gun of 10 in indirect fire mosition suspenting the 15th Inf Regt, fired 5 harassing missions with a total of 293 rds 3 ME (RC) expended. During the night of 10 - 11 Jan, 1 Fon ran contact patrols to the 2nd En. 16th Inf Regt: 2 Pcn continued to man their positions in Libomont; 3 Ron was in reserve and the Pieneer Plateen ran contact patrols to the 3rd Dn, 120th Inf Regt.

k. 11 January: Weather: Cloudy and cold. Wasibility: Fair.

Company A remained in same positions. Company 3 new no action, and the one (') gim of 10 that was in indirect fire position at (839060) returned to the 1st Platoon. During the night of 11 - 12 Jan. 1 Ren was in reserve; 2 Ren maintained resitions in Liboment; 3 Ren ran contact patrols to 1st 2nd 3n, 16th Inf Regt: & the Pioneer Platoon ran contact patrols to the 3rd Bn, 120th Inf Pert.


1. 12 January: Weather: Cold & clear to cloudy. Visibility:


Good to fair.

Companies A & C remained in same locations, and no action was reported. The one (1) gun of 1B fired two (2) illuminating missions during the night. 4 rds Star Shell were expended. During the night 1 Ren contacted by patrols, the 3rd Bn, 120th Inf Rest on the right: 2 Ron maintained their positions in Libomont, 3 Rem contacted 1st '2nd Bn's 16th Inf Regt on the left. Pioneer Platoon was in reserve.

13 January: Weather: Cold, clear to cloudy. Visibility: Good to fair.

The situation in Commanies A & B remained the same, with

no action reported. 1C supporting the 1st Bn. 16th Inf Regt, was in reserve positions at (863048). 2C supporting the 2nd Bn, moved to AT positions at (848029). 3C supporting the 3rd Bn, was in reserve positions at (886039). The Co C, CF moved from Walk, Belgium to Ducuzaine, Belgium (862049). During the night of 13 - 14 Jan, 1 Ren ran contact patrols to the 3rd Bn, 120th Inf Regt; 2 Ren maintained their resitions in Libomont-3 Ren ran contact patrols to the 1st 2 2nd Bn's, 16th Inf Regt; and the Pieneer Plateon guarded the road block near the Co CP.

n. 14 January: Weather. Clear & cold; Visibility: Good to very good.

Some enemy artilleny fell in the area occumied by 24 during the morning. A fr sment from an air-burst went through the floor of an M-10, cutting an oil line. The oil line was remained in the position. The gun of LF that was in an indirect fire position at (879076) returned to 1B at Midrum during the evening. Positions of Co C remained the same with no action reported. All road block positions and contact patrols which Ech Co operated were discontinued.

o. 15 January: Weather: Clear and cold in the morning, becoming overcast at non. Visibility: Good.

In the early morning of 15 Jan the 1st U.S. Infantry jumped off from positions which had been held since the 12 SS Panzer Division had tried to force a passage north at the beginning of the German breakthrough to the west. The objectives were as follows: The 16th CT on the right was to capture Formonville, the 18th CT, in the center was to take the high ground about 1400 pards south of their line of denarture, I the 25th CT on the left was to hold, demonstrate and support the attack by fire. The snow was doen and the going was very difficult.

Company A remained in the same positions, in support of the 26th Inf. 3B in support of the attack by the 3rd Bn, 18th Inf. moved to an essembly area at (383038). At 0830, they moved to (892031) and occupied direct fire positions. 150 rds 3" HE (NL) and 11 rds 3" APC were expended firing on Ey MG positions in woods in vicinity of (392025) and (891026). After firing, they withdrew to (890033) to resumply ammunition. This firing and withdrawing, heavy arty and mortar fire fell upon them. At least one (1) eying was silenced permanently. 15 % 2 remained in the positions as of the provious day. 10 moved at 0700 in support of the attack of the 1st bm, 16th Infattack and reached (368015). One (1) By EG strong-noint at (364021) was neutrolized by 34 fire. 20 remained at Weismes. 30 moved at 0700 in support of the 3rd Bn's attack through Faymonville and reached (333023). 30 neutralized three (3) Ly NG strong-noints at ("32029), (875025), & (375025). 35rds 3" APC and 99 rds 3' & (NC) expended. Resides the 3" fire, the destroyers supported the Ind by fire of the 50 Gal ag's on the turnets of the E-10's 2 Hb WIA, one of which remained on duty. I hop @ 3Ron were alerted and moved to 2 Ren positions at Liboront at 0700 with rission to be prepared to move and set-up road blocks at road junctions (835013) & (339012) amore imately 12 miles SW of Weismes. The mission was called off and all personnel returned to their former locations by 2100.

p. 16 January: "Cather: Cold & slightly cloudy to clear. Visibility: Fair to good

The attack continued, and On A remained in the vicinity of Butgenbach. At 150400A. 38 Withdrew to their former position at (395037). 18 & 21 remained in the same positions, and no action was reported for the day. To in support of 1st by, 15th Inf moved to AT positions at (365013). 20 in support of On K, moved at 150400A to

(875010). 30 remained at (881020) in support of 3rd 3n. Ron remained in the same positions in Walk, and Libomont in Division Peserve.

q. 17 January: Weather: Gold with intermittent snow. Visibility: Poor.

The attack continued and Company a remained in its same positions supporting the 26th Inf Regt. 18 moved in support of the 1st En, 13th Inf Regt from its reserve positions in Nidrum to an assembly area in the vicinity of Lignueville (805989). The first Bn, 18th Inf was attached to the 23rd Inf, in an effort to out-flank the enemy positions south of the Amel River. 2B & 3B remained in the same positions, and saw no action. 20 supporting the drive of the 15th Inf Regt, had one section in mobile reserve and one section in AT positions at (372070). The one section in mobile reserve was given the mission of moving to (880008)-and fire 16 rds 3" ME (NC) and 4 rds 3" APC at enemy infantry and vehicles known to be in the woods to their front (882007). This was repeated every hour between the hours of 1300 and 1700. After each mission, the section withdrew. 2C also fired 2 rds 3" HVAP at a Mk V Tank at (830008), both rounds striking and apparently jamming the turret. The tank then backed into the woods & disappeared. Ron Company moved from Walk, Belgium with TF"D" closing in at 1345A. The CP of TF"D" was established at (887038) and the CP of Rcn Co at (887047). TF"D" was given the mission of relieving Co K, 16th Inf Regt and Co I, 18th Inf Regt on the line east of Faymonville in the vicinity of (3002) and holding this line while the Infantry continued the attack. 1 For & 3 Ron were attached to the 1st Ron Troop and relieved Co K by 1600.

r. 18 January: Weather: Cold and snow with high winds. Visibility: Poor.

Co A remained in their positions and reported no action. 3B supporting the attack of the 3rd Bn, 18th Inf Regt moved one section at a time from (895038) to (903032) and fired at a concentration of Ty infantry in the woods at (905015) and then returned to (895038) by going through Butgenbach. During the afternoon, 141 rds 3" HE (NC), 121 rds 3" HE (RC) and 33rds 3" APC were expended. 2 and 3B remained in same positions and saw no action. 10 was in support of the attack by Co B, 15th Inf Regt who swung around to the west through the 23rd Inf Regt with the intention of taking its objective in the northern edge of the Rohr Busch from the east. The Co ran into heavy arty fire and got involved in a powerful counter-attack which was directed at the 23rd Inf. The counterattack was very expensive for the enemy as a large percentage of the attacking force was killed out-right; 10 fired 70 rds HE at Ey Inf in woods at (885995). The platoon reached (861000). 20 in support of the 2nd Bn, 15th Inf, with one section in close support of Co E & the other in close support of Co F, reached the vicinity of (878004). At 182400A, 30 in support of Co L moved from (331029) to (870013) to be in position for the attack the following morning. 2 Ron & the Pioneer Platoon moved out at 0300 from Meywertz, and relieved Co I, 18th Inf. The Company remained in their positions in the vicinity (8902) throughout the day. 4 PM were wounded by Ey mortar shells during the day, of which one was evacnated.

g. 19 January: Weather: Cold with snow flurries. Visibility:

Company A stayed in the same position.

norming to be in positions for the coming attack by the last Bn, 26th Inf Regt. 24 moved from Dom Butgenbach during the early morning to a reserve position in the vicinity of the Co CP. 34 remained in Butgenbach. 18 moved during the afterneon and occupied direct fire positions 1 mile south of Butgenbach (900033). 28 remained at (913037). 38 moved during the afternoon to occupy direct fire positions one (1) mile south of Butgenbach (910029). All platerns were in readiness to support the attack by the Inf the following day. All plateons of Company "C" remained in same locations. Hen Co remained in an assembly area attached to TF"D" in Division reserve.





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x. 24 January: "eather: Cold & overcast, clearing in the PM. Visibility: Fair to good.

1A moved in support of the attack by the 1st Bn, 26th Inf Regt to the south. One (1) M-10 was rendered immobile by Fy Arty fire in Dom Butgenbach. Two (2) other M-10's ran over Fy mines blowing a track off both vehicles. Two (2) FM WIA of which one (1) was evacuated. The remaining M-10 retruned to the assembly area at Dom Butgenbach. 2A moved forward to Dom Butgenbach to reinforce 1A. 3A remained in Butgenbach (913041). 2B moved from Butgenbach in support of the 2nd Bn, 18th Inf & occupied AT positions at (930038). 1B remained in the vicinity of Butgenbach and 3B remained in reserve at Nidrum. 1C supporting the 1st Bn, 16th Inf, moved 1st section to AT positions at (887980) and 2nd section in AT positions at (891980). 2C supporting the 2nd Bn, moved 1st section to AT positions at (892987), and 2nd section to AT positions at (891980). 3C remained in AT positions at (892002). 1A had one gun remaining at (930008) and with 2 guns repaired, had two in reserve at Dom Butgenbach. 2A & 3A remained in reserve in Butgenbach. 3B in support of the 3rd Bn, 18th Inf, moved from reserve positions at Nidrum to Moderscheid (908993). 1B & 2B remained in same locations. 1C moved from (837980) & (891980) at 0900 to occupy AT positions in support of the 1st Bn, 16th Inf Regt at (898963). 2C moved from (892937) & (891980) to a reserve position in Faymonville at (865018). 3C remained at (900965). Ron Co remained with TF"D" in Div. Reserve at Weywertz. At 1800, the Bn was released from atchmt to V US Army Corps & atchd to XVIII US army Corps (Airborne).

aa. 27 January: Weather: Cold & overcast. Visibility: Fair.

This was a quiet day along the whole division front and all companies remained in the same positions as of the previous day. 30 during the night fired 75 rds HI (NC) & 3 rds APC into the town of Valender. This was direct fire from their position at (900965).

bb. 28 January: "Teather: Cold with heavy snowfall in the early part of the period with snow flurries and overcast in the late morning and afternoon. Visibility: Poor.

The First Division attacked in the early morning with the 26th Infantry Regt on the left, the 16th Inf Boft in the center and the 18th Inf Regt on the right. Company a remained in the locations as the road network did not permit their use. 18 & 25 moved forward in support of the 1st & 2nd Bns 18th Inforespectively, 18 reaching their



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objective and went into AT positions at (930007), and 2B reached Heppenbach (929970). 3B remained in the same positions as of the previous day. The 16th Inf after a short advance was squeezed out and went into division reserve. 3C supporting the attack of the 18th Inf Regt on Heppenbach, fired 64 rds HE (NC) at personnel in woods along line running from (900957) to (910958) and also in the town of Valender (908957). An undetermined number of Ey personnel were killed or wounded, but it is known to be over 100. 1C & 3C reverted to Company control during the afternoon. TF"D" was alerted during the afternoon and given the mission of screening the right flank of the Division in the vicinity of Heppenbach, and to also assist in the defense of the town. Ren Co was reinforced by 1 Plantoon of Assault guns, 2 Platoons of light tanks & 1 platoon of mortars of the 745th Tk Bn, received the mission of reinforcing Co "G", 18th Inf Regt in the town of Heppenbach. The Co moved into town without resistance and took up positions in and around the town.

cc. 29 January: "eather: Cold & cloudy with strong wind. Visibility: Fair."

1A remained in positions with one (1) Gun at (931008) in AT positions and two (2) gums in reserve at Dom Butgenbach. 2A & 3A moved to Bullingen during the afternoon, 2A at 1745A & 3A at 1630A. The move was in preparation for the attack the following day. The company CP moved from the vicinity of Camp Elsenborn during the morning to the vicinity of Teywertz at (387037). 1B in support of the 1st Bn reached positions 3 miles east of Hepscheid (947987). 2B moved at about 2100A from Heppenbach to join 1B (947987) and 3B moved from Moderscheid to join 1B (947987) at about 2100A. This grouping was in preparation for the attack the following morning. 1C & 3C were assembled in the vicinity of the Co CP (862049). 2C remained in reserve with the 2nd Bn, 16th Inf at Faymonville. All platoons spent the period in motor maintenance and in cleaning equipment. Rcn Co with TF"D" remained in Heppenbach and outposted the town.

dd. 20 January: Cold with snow flurries turning to sleet. Visibility: Fair to poor.

lA remained in positions of previous day. 2A in support of the 2nd Bn, 18th Inf, moved from Bullingen to Murringen (981020). 3A remained in aT positions in Bullingen. The CP of Co B moved from the vicinity of Butgenbach to Hepscheid (927985). All platoons moved in support of the 1st Bn, 18th Inf Regt in their attack on Honsfeld (9698). 1B from (969989) fired 12 rds HE and 1 rd APC destroying 2 Ey towed 75mm AT Guns at (973988) and (974988). 1B also fired 2 rds APC on an Ey tank, but the tank withdrew, apparently unharmed. The platoons went into AT positions at Honsfeld (962989). 2B finished mission at 0330 and returned to Heppenbach at (922973). 3B fired 56 rds HE from (973993) in support of the 3rd Bn attack on Hunningen (9700). Co C remained in same locations for rest and maintenance. Ron Co remained in Heppenbach with TF"D" and continued to outpost the town.

ee. 31 January: Teather: Warmer and overcast with light rain. Visibility: Poor.

lA moved to positions NE of Hurringen with one (1) Gun in AT position at (911037) and the remaining 2 M-10's at (906049). The crews of the two (2) M-10's at (906049) laid mines across the road in vicinity of (905052). Two (2) Ey SP 75mm Assault Guns came down the road and ran over the mines detonating them and the TD's immediately took them under fire, destroying them. 1 AT Gun (towed) was also destroyed. 4 rds APC and 4 rds M (NC) were expended. 2A remained in Murringen during the day. 3A in support of the 3rd Gn, 25th Inf Regt, moved to vicinity of (905045). 15 remained in Honsfeld; 2B moved from





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Heppenbach to Hunningen and took AT positions at (975007) and (978006). 3B remained in Hunningen at (977003) and (973009). Co C remained in same positions for rest and maintanance. Ech Go remained in Heppenbach attached to TF"D" and continued to outpost the town.
