

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SUBJECT: Unit Report of Action 1 - 31 May 1945.

TO : The Adjutant General War Department Washington, D. C.

1. Narrative:

a. 1 May 1945: "eather: Intermittent snow and rain.

Visibility: Poor.

As the period opened the 634th TD Bn remained attached to the 1st U. S. Infantry Division. Co A was attached to the 26th Inf Regt; Co B was atchd to the 18th Inf Regt; Co C was atchd to 16th Inf Regt, and Acn Co was atchd to 18th Inf Regt. The remainder of the Battalion (Hq & Hq Co) was atchd to the 1st U. S. Infantry Division.

The Battalion was disposed as follows: Hq & Hq Co were situated in ASCH, Czechoslovakia. The Bn CP at (179889). Co A CP remained in ASCH, Czechoslovakia (180898). The platoons occupied the following positions at the close of the period: 1A in Regtl Reserve at Co CP; 2A moved fwd to place 1st section in MUHL-HAUSEN (220983), 2nd section in SOHL (234964): 3A moved fwd and occupied positions in RAUN with 1st Section at (242938) and 2nd Section in OBER-ERAMBACH (255913). Co "B" CP moved from NOTHENBACH to CHEB (305745). The platoons were disposed as follows: 1B in Regtl Res at Co CP (305745); 2B in AT positions supporting E Co (313721); 3B in AT positions with 1st Section at DCLSHDN (347754), 2nd section at JINDERICHOW (335778). Co C CP remained in SELB (132841) and the platoons were disposed as follows: 1C moved from 3CHONBERG to BEAMBACH and occupied AT positions at (262901); 2C with 2nd Bn occupied AT positions in HAGENGRUN (263827); 3C in Regtl I as at Co CP. Econ Co (-1R, Zh and 1 section of Pioneer Platoon) moved from "ALDSASSEN to EGEN (CHEB) (309741). During the period 1E plus 1 section of Pioneer Platoon maintained a road block position at (233638) and operated patrols between elements of 1st Div and 97th Inf Div from their location at (383638). 2E maintained strong point at STRIZOV (307775) and maintained 24 hour contact patrols between I & L Cos of 18th Inf. 3E made mounted Econ of the area bounded by 20 to 28 NS Grid lines and 70 to 80 EW Grid lines. No enemy contacted.

b. 2 May 1945: Weather: Cloudy with snow flurries.

Visibility: Fair

Co A CP remained in ASCH, Czechoslovakia. All platoons remained in positions as of 1 May 1945. No contact with the enemy and no casualities. Co B CP remained in FGTR (CHEB), Czechoslovakia. All platoons remained in positions as of 1 May 1945. No contact with the enemy and no casualties. Co C CP remained in position as of 1 May 1945. No contact with the enemy and no casualties. Ron Co CP moved during the period to MATER STEUTH (348646). During the period 1R plus 1 section of Pioneer Platoon moved to 0000B to screen right flank of G Co and entered QUFREN-BACH (339658). A light fire fight was encountered on outskirts of town. 3 enemy were killed and 25 PWs taken. Continued on with G Co to NATERS. REUTH (348646) thence to NEVALBENGFUTH (375640). No enemy encountered.

Contact patrols maintained during night between MATERSREUTH (348646), QUERENBACH (338658) and HATZENREUTH (324671). 2R remained in position at (307775). 3R and Co Hg personnel made mounted Rcn to PAXDORF (325634) and captured 2 PWs. 3R maintained contact patrols to Co C, 303rd Inf Regt of 97th Inf Div during the period and traveled through the following towns: MATERSREUTH (348646) and ERNESTARUN (373622).

c. <u>3 May 1945</u>: Weather: Continued cool and cloudy.

Visibility: Fair.

Co A CP and all platoons remained in positions as of 2 May 1945 except 1st section of 2A who moved to a better defensive positions in vicinity of ADORF (198995). Co B CP remained in EGER (CHEB), (305745). Platoons were disposed as follows at close of period: 1B in reserve at Co CP (305745), 2B with E Co at (349647). 3B fired 24 rds HF and 4 rds APC from firing positions at (348573) destroying 1 armored car, killing and wounding many enemy infantry. Platoon remained disposed as follows: 1st Section in DOL-SHON (347754); 2nd section in JINDFICHDW (335778). Co C CP and all platoons remained in positions as of 2 May 1945. Ech Cc CP remained in MATERSREUTH (348646). CAPT JAMES BARDOW, Tec 5 Caldwell, and Tec 5 Neihouse were captured by an enemy combat patrol during the night of 2 - 3 May 1945, between hours of 0040E and 0100B. Many items of G-2 information were taken such as SOI, Slidex Cords, maps and codes. The 18th CT and elements of Ech Co made numerous azgressive patrols into enemy held territory in an effort to find the captives, but to no avail.

d. <u>4 May 1945</u>: Weather: Continued cool and cloudy.

Visibility: Fair.

Co A CP and all platoons remained in positions as of 3 May 1945 except that 1A relieved 2A in place. Co B CP and all platoons remained in positions as of 3 May 1945 except 23 moved from (315723) to occupy AT positions in HATZENAFUTH (323670). 27 fired 25 rds HE at a convoy of horse drawn vehicles in vicinity of (353779). 2 PTs were taken by 38. Co C CP and all platoons remained in positions as of 3 May 1945 except 2C moved to AT positions in support of G Co, 2nd in, 15th Inf Segt at (300785). Ren Co Continued contact patrols to elements of 18th Inf Kegt and 303d Inf Regt of the 97th Inf Div. In addition, numerous combat patrols were performed into enemy territory in an endeavor to discover some information concerning the 3 missing men. During the patrols, a flashlight of one of the TM mas found, also 38 PTs were taken and 1 Volkswagen destroyed by 37mm HE. 10 rds 37mm HE and 1000 rds Cal..30 MG ammunition was expended.

c. 5 May 1945: "eather: Fainy.

Visibility: Fair to poor.

Co A CP and all platcons remained in positions as of 4 May 1945. 2A alerted for movement with 2nd Bn into the attack. 3A assembled in OBER-BEAMBACH (257916). Co B CP remained in position and 1° released from Tegt1 Les to attachment to 1st Bn, 18th Inf. 1B moved to join 1st Bn at 13005 and at close of period was located in LEPP TRUCK (423713). 2° moved from MATAENTFUTH (323670), in support of 2nd Bn, to MAISELGEUN (448647). 2B destroyed 2 NG nests expending 25 rds HT. 35 moved find with 3rd Bn to seize their objective. During the period, 35 expended 136 rds HF, 2100 rds Cal. 50 MC and destroyed 3 NG nests, killed 50 enemy and also overran 4 MG nests with their tracks after expending all HE on their vehicles. All firing was done at a range of 50 to 100 yerds. 1 N-10 was hit by a

Panserfaust and set on fire. Crow members extinguished the blaze and vehicle was not seriously damaged. 1st section located at (348752) with 2nd section at (368737). Co C CP moved to FRANTLAZNE (304785) and all plateens moved forward with their respective infantry battalions to cocupy the following resitions at the close of the period: 1C in NBES (341856), 2C in HALTOUSOV (380811), 3C in KOANOV (385770). Hen Go CP moved forward to DOLZANDOV (449687). It 1500B, the plateens were assigned and moved with the Ens as follows: 1R atchd to 1st Bn, 2T atchd to 3rd Bn and 3F atchd to 2nd Bn. 1 section of Pioneer Tlateen joined 2T at 2130B. At the close of the period the plateens were dispessed as follows: 11 at (405700), 2R at (345753) & 3T at (448585).

f. 6 May 1945: Teather: Dainy.

Visibility: Fair to peer.

En (- Cos A, E, C & Ren) me ved from SOH, Czechoslovakia (170889) to new CP in EGER (CHEB), Czechoslovakia (308744). Co A CP re-mained in ASCH, Czechoslovakia. Platoons moved as follows: lA moved at 0900B with 1st Bn from SOHL and at the close of meriod were in positions as follows: 1st section at (330940) and 2nd section in "FINUTZGRUM (300980). 24 remained in Negtl Fos at Co CP, while 34 moved at 12008 from assembly position in OBER-BLAMBACH to les position in STFINGERD (310910). On B CP moved from FGFE, Czechoslovakia to DOLZANDOV (447687). All plateens meved forward in support of their respective Inf ins and were disposed as follows at the close of the period: 12 in SaNOT Fig (573730), 2B in MNICHOV (514722) and 3B in KECTETNSFF (433755). 3 fired 16 rds HE at Ey Inf. Good results were reported. Go C CP remained in FRANTLAZNE (295785). Platoons were disposed as follows: 10 detached from C Cr 16th Inf and atchd to B Cr at (342856). 10 expended 77 rds WE and 1 rd APC, 200 rds Cal..50 NG and 1200 rds Cal..30 NG to destroy 5 NG nests, neutralize 3 strong points, 8 Ey killed, 8 wounded. 2 P"s were also captured. 20 in support of E Co was still roving at the close of the period and were at (417784). 20 rds 42, 3000 rds Col.. 30 iG and 300 rds Cal..50 MG ammunition was expended by 20 to destroy 15 by strong points, 20 Ey were also killed, 15 wounded and 4 PTs taken. 30 atchd to I Co was at (451794) at the close of the period and had destroyed 1 AT Gun, neutralized Ey Inf rositions with an apprunition expenditure of 1 rd APC, 9 rds HF, 400 rds Cal. 30 13. Ren Co GT remained in DOLZANDCV (449686). 2R moved in support of 3rd Bn, 13th Inf, leading K Co into SITHOR (430729) and then East in support of K Co to capture RCC-AMDORF (400745). Platoon relieved at 21308 and assembled in DOL JANDOV (140686). 1R with 1 sound of colored dough-boys, roved from DOLZANDOV to rake contact from LAYNEKYNZJAET (500681) to (500725). A fire fight developed at (500700). 6 Enemy killed, 1 MG destroyed, and neveral Ty mounded. 1 FM SWA. Platoon re-assembled in DOLZANDOV. 3R led 2nd Bn from NFTALFIN-REUTH (3764) to MAITRSCRUN (148643) and worked with Bn until relieved at 2230B when they assembled in DOLZANDOV. Pioneer Platoon made counted contact patrol during the night from DOLZANDOV to SEGTESSERG (565731).

g. 7 May 1945: "Cather: Excelient.

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Visibility: Gred.

OPERATIONS MEMORANDUM

The following telegram received from SHAFF, reproduced by V Corps, is furnished for your information and compliance.

> 1. A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE GERMAN HIGH COMMAND SIGNED THE UNCONDITIONAL SUBRENDER OF ALL GERMAN LAND, SEA, AND AIR FORCES IN EUROPE TO THE ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE AND SIMULTANEOUSLY TO THE SOVIET HIGH CONMAND AT 0141 HOURS CENTRAL EUROPEAN TIME, 7 MAY UNDER THICH ALL FORCES WILL CRASE ACTIVE OPERATIONS AT 0001B HOURS 9 MAY.

2. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY ALL OFFENSIVE OPERATIONS BY ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE WILL CEASE AND TROOPS WILL REMAIN IN PRETENT POSITIONS. MOVES INVOLVED IN OCCUPAT-IONAL DUTIES WILL CONTINUE. DUE TO DIFFICULTIES OF COM-MUNICATIONS THERE MAY BE SOME DELAY IN SIMILAR OFDERS REACHING ENEMY TROOPS SO FULL DEFENSIVE PRECAUTIONS WILL BE TAKEN.

3. ALL INFORMED DOWN TO AND INCLUDING DIVISIONS, TACT-ICAL AIR COMMANDS AND GROUPS, BASE SECTIONS, AND FOULY-ALENT. NO RELEASE WILL BE MADE TO THE PURSS PRODING AM ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE HEADS OF THE THEFE GOVERNMENTS. SIGNED EISENHOWER.

Basic policy of the Division Commander is that all units will secure themselves in present positions against any energy action by uninformed enemy groups. No man will be lost unnecessarily at this time.

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h. Period 7 May 1945 to 31 May 1945.

During this period of nost hostilities the 634th TD En was assembled as a unit and assigned a sector of the Division front; with the mission of allowing no German civilians, German soldiers, nor displaced persons to pass through the defensive system of Boad blocks and traffic



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Unit Report of Action 1 - 31 Hay 1945 cont'd.

control points extending from FALKENAU on the North to LAUTERBACH on the South. Companies were assigned areas as follows: Ron Co on left flank and maintaining road blocks on outskirts of FALKENAU, "A" Co in WUNDIN-GRUN, "B" Co in KOHLING, and Co "C' maintained a traffic control point and outpost in SCHLAGGENWALD. The Bn CP was located in Lobs, Czechoslovakia (537822). Although the actual fighting had ceased, many problems presented themselves and required many hours of labor, coordination and personal contact by the Bn and Unit Commanders with the representatives of Russian and Gzechoslovakian Governments.


